Day 1: Arusha, Tanzania

Arusha

Arusha is the safari capital of Tanzania located at the foot of Mt. Meru, close to Mount Kilimanjaro, the Manyara, Tarangire and Ngorongoro National Parks. From there it's only a short trip to the Serengeti. Just to the north, on the slopes of Mt. Meru is the Arusha National Park. Built by the Germans as a centre of colonial administration because of the temperate climate, Arusha is a good spot to take a day or two off from your safari.

Day Itinerary

Upon your arrival at Kilimanjaro International Airport, you will be met and transferred to your hotel. Take the remainder of the day to unwind and rejuvenate, or indulge in optional activities of your choice.

Overnight: Four Points by Sheraton Arusha The Arusha Hotel

The Arusha Hotel has been Arusha's centerpiece since 1894 and is regarded as Tanzania's Art Hotel. Home to those travelling between the Cape and Cairo... and further afield in these modern times, its lengthy and vivid history stands as true today as it did over a hundred years ago. Inside the highest quality rooms, services and cuisine all come in surroundings that reflect its history, sophistication and charm. Outside the original lush and extensive tropical gardens give the hotel a calm and relaxing feel - an oasis in the center of Arusha town.

Day 2: Tarangire Safari Lodge, Tanzania

Tarangire National Park

After the Serengeti, Tarangire has the greatest concentration of wildlife in Tanzania and in the dry season the Tarangire River is a magnet for thirsty wildlife. Large herds of elephants and migratory wildebeest, zebra, buffalo, impala, gazelle, hartebeest and eland gather and not surprisingly the predators follow. This is also the one place in Tanzania where dry-country antelope such as oryx and gerenuk are regularly spotted. Tarangire is also known for its spectacular baobab trees, and its breathtaking views of the Masai Steppe and the mountains to the south. Located just a few hours drive from the town of Arusha, Tarangire is a popular stop for safaris travelling through the northern circuit on their way to Ngorongoro and the Serengeti. The park extends into two game controlled areas and the wildlife are allowed to move freely throughout.

Day Itinerary

Today, we embark on a journey to Tarangire National Park, a true hidden gem a hidden treasure teeming with abundant wildlife and boasting a variety of bird species found in one habitat, making it a truly remarkable destination. Immerse yourself in the wonders of this park as you delight in an afternoon game drive.

Overnight: Tarangire Safari Lodge

Tarangire Safari Lodge is located within the national park boundary of Tarangire National Park, approximately 10 km away from the main entrance. Perched at the edge of a natural bluff, the lodge is renowned for its panoramic views of the Savannah and Tarangire River below, providing breathtaking scenery and game viewing. The lodge's safari tents, with thatched roofs and large, mesh screened windows, provide the ideal opportunity to connect with the sights and sounds of nature. Each tent has a comfortable veranda, ideal for bird and game viewing, or reading a favorite book after a dusty safari. With a choice of twin, double, or triple accommodation, all tents are equipped with en suite bathrooms with solar heated showers, ample cupboard space and a cultural touch of local textiles. The five circular bungalows, built in a similar style to the Maasai boma, offer a more spacious option for family and triple accommodation. The airy rooms are situated near a large watering hole, creating the opportunity to watch wildlife from the shaded veranda. The bungalows are set away from the main lodge, providing privacy, and all are equipped with large en suite bathrooms with solar heated showers, and comfortable bedding made from local textiles.

Day 3: Greater Ngorongoro Area, Tanzania

Ngorongoro Region

The Ngorongoro Conservation Area is a vast and diverse landscape, encompassing highland plains, savanna, savanna woodlands, and forests. It was established in 1959 as a unique area where wildlife coexists harmoniously with semi-nomadic Maasai pastoralists who practice traditional livestock grazing. The highlight of the conservation area is the awe-inspiring Ngorongoro Crater, the largest caldera in the world. This area holds immense global importance for biodiversity conservation, as it is home to numerous globally threatened species and boasts a high density of wildlife. Additionally, the annual migration of wildebeest, zebras, gazelles, and other animals into the northern plains further contributes to the area's significance and natural spectacle.

Day Itinerary

Start your day with an invigorating early morning game drive in the Tarangire National Park. Afterward, we venture towards the vibrant town of Mto-wa-Mbu, where you'll embark on a cultural immersion and have the opportunity to explore local curio shops. In the afternoon, we continue our journey to our exclusive fly camp nestled in the breathtaking Greater Ngorongoro area.

Overnight: Out of Africa - Fly Camp (Ngoro-Simba or Sero 11 area)

Day 4: Serengeti National Park, Tanzania

Serengeti National Park

The Serengeti together with Kenya's Masai Mara Game Park form Africa's most famous wildlife park. The image of acacia trees on an endless grass plain epitomises Africa for many, and then add a Masai warrior and some cattle to the picture and the conversation need go no further. The annual wildebeest migration through the Serengeti and the Masai Mara is the largest mass movement of land mammals on the planet – with more than a million animals following the rains. But that is not where the game viewing ends; large prides of lions, elephants and giraffes in grasslands, gazelles and eland to mention but a few. Aside from traditional vehicle safaris, hot-air ballooning over the Serengeti plains has become almost essential and you can even do a horseback safari.

Day Itinerary

Embark on an early morning game drive from our base camp, venturing into the mesmerizing Serengeti National Park, renowned for its iconic landscapes in East Africa. As you traverse the vast expanse of the park, prepare to be enthralled by the presence of Africa's most majestic wildlife, including lions, elephants, giraffes, zebras, wildebeest, and many others. The sweeping plains, adorned with acacia trees and towering termite mounds, create a truly awe-inspiring backdrop for your unforgettable adventure.

Overnight: Out of Africa - Mobile Tented Camp

Our Out of Africa Mobile Camp offers an authentic and mobile tented camp experience in two stunning locations: Ndutu and Serengeti. The camp strategically moves between these locations throughout the year to provide guests with front-row seats to the breathtaking wildebeest migration. Each camp is set up in picturesque surroundings, guaranteeing a high-quality safari adventure. The camp offers an exceptional bush and wildlife experience with top-notch guiding, reliable vehicles, and remote camping locations. Day 5-7: Serengeti National Park, Tanzania

Ndutu

Set in the Arusha Region, Ndutu is situated in the northern part of the Ngorongoro Conservation Area within the magnificent Serengeti. The surrounding landscapes are covered in sweeping grasslands which provide the perfect habitat for the migratory route for hundreds of thousands of wildebeest, antelope and zebra. Visitors can look forward to exploring the forest around Lake Ndutu, spotting an array of wildlife, and visiting the fascinating archaeological site at the Olduvai Gorge. Don't miss the opportunity to jump on a game drive to view the spectacular herds of the annual Great Migration, enjoy a scenic hot air balloon ride over the plains and take a guided tour with the local Maasai and learn about culture and traditions. Other

commonly spotted species include: leopard, lion, cheetah, caracal, serval, African wildcat, and a variety of prolific birdlife.

Mara River

The Mara River, stretching across Narok County in southern Kenya and the Mara Region in northern Tanzania, originates from the Kenyan highlands and meanders through the grasslands of the Maasai Mara in Kenya and the northern part of the Serengeti National Park in Tanzania, eventually emptying into Lake Victoria. Spanning 395 kilometers in length and encompassing a surface area of 13,504 square kilometers, the Mara River is renowned for its breathtaking and occasionally dramatic scenes, particularly from June to October, when millions of wildebeests brave the river's currents and face the perilous threats of crocodile attacks. This year-round water source attracts not only elephants but also a substantial number of hippos, while the vast plains provide excellent opportunities for up-close encounters with rhinos and cheetahs in pursuit of gazelles.

Day Itinerary

Embark on an extraordinary journey as our mobile camp follows the mesmerizing sea of wildebeest and zebras during the Great Migration. Prepare to be captivated as breathtaking scenes continuously unfold before your eyes, with these herds stampeding across the plains and leaving billowing clouds of dust in their wake.

Our path leads us to the Mara River, the pinnacle of this annual odyssey, where a thrilling climax awaits—the heart-stopping crossing over crocodile-infested waters into Kenya's magnificent Masai Mara. Brace yourself for an unforgettable experience as you witness this remarkable natural phenomenon.

Day 7: Serengeti via Arusha - West Kilimanjaro, Tanzania

West Kilimanjaro

Located to the north of Mount Meru in northeastern Tanzania, West Kilimanjaro is a concession south of Kenya's Amboseli National Park. Wild, unspoilt and often overlooked in a clamour for the peak, this extraordinary destination is a wonderful place for private game viewing, hiking, night drives, horse safaris, and more. Vast stretches of savannah dotted with acacia woodland and wild bush are home to large numbers of elephants, as well as wildebeest, buffalo, gerenuk, warthog, zebra, giraffe, lesser kudus, and shy predators such as cheetahs, leopards, lions, hyenas, and jackals. Abundant birdlife adds appeal - spot tawny eagles, Masai ostrich, and more. The ancient Masaai tribe lives here with their cattle among the wildlife and allows visitors to stay with them and learn about their unique culture.

Day Itinerary

Indulge in a final delectable breakfast amidst the breathtaking wilderness before embarking on a game drive to the airstrip for your return flight to Arusha. Upon arrival, you will be transferred to your lodge, where the remainder of the afternoon can be spent unwinding by the pool. Take this time to unwind and reflect upon the unforgettable safari experience.

Overnight: Africa Amini Life Original Maasai Lodge

Africa Amini Life Original Maasai Lodge is located in Ngare Nanyuki, Tanzania. The accommodation offers 16 earth houses with solar-powered energy. Each bungalow features a toilet and shower with hot water. Guests can enjoy delicious international and traditional Swahili dishes at the on-site restaurant. Guests can enjoy the sunrise behind Kilimanjaro on the terrace and activities such as spear throwing, dances, nature walks or campfire conversations. Leisure facilities include a relaxation area, massage room, swimming pool and sauna.

Travel Information

Safari Do's and Dont's:

Jenman Safaris has extensive knowledge and experience in most African Countries. Throughout the many years we have learnt about a few "Do's and Dont's" while travelling in and around Africa. We have therefore developed this list for you to read at your leisure. All tips are not always relevant to all the areas that you travel to – depending on your tour.

Due to a lack of transparent and credible regulation relating to ethically acceptable practices where captive wildlife is concerned, Jenman African Safaris has taken the decision not to support any activities that include physical contact with captive wildlife. We urge you to consider the ethical implications of taking part in any such activity that may be offered at your lodge.

Arriving for Safari

Get some rest on the first day of your arrival – you may need some time to adjust to a different time zone. Rather arrive a day early to rest and start off your tour refreshed and ready for adventure!

Currency

When you need to exchange your currency, avoid any exchanges on the street or in other areas that may seem suspect. Always note that even when people approach you with an, e.g., 50% premium exchange rate offer, this exchange is considered part of the black market and is illegal! Hotels, Camps and Lodges can change money, but sometimes the rate is slightly lower. We recommend that you visit an accredited Bureau de Change.

Credit Cards

Credit cards such as Visa and MasterCard are widely accepted in most areas as well as at bigger hotels and lodges.

Hospitals and Pharmacies

The larger towns in Southern Africa have pharmacies and hospitals, but you should always make sure you have enough of your medicine in case the pharmacies/hospitals don't stock them.

Telephone

In most areas you can call internationally – however please note that some of the smaller areas may not have these facilities and international phone calls are costly. Also, built up areas and towns do have cell-phone reception!

Passports, Documents and Valuables

Please make sure that you keep your passport, documents and any other valuables with you at all times! We recommend that a copy of these documents should be made and kept in another safe place in case something happens to the originals. Never leave valuables alone and remember you are on safari, so expensive and valuable jewellery is not necessary.

Safety

Every area (any where in the world) can be unsafe at times. Please take common precautions at all times and never walk alone, especially at night or in run-down areas!

Packing

Remember to always check the amount of luggage you are allowed to take on the plane as well as on the Safari Vehicle – they may differ. We recommend that a soft bag is used instead of a hard suitcase as it's preferable on safari. Most air flights allow for 20kgs and our scheduled safaris are limited to 15kgs per person. Don't forget to put luggage tags on your suitcases (for the airplane and the safari).

Luggage and Medication

Please be advised that you should put any medication that you need (e.g.: diabetes medication) into your hand luggage, even with the strict regulations, airlines will allow that as long as you have a letter from your doctor.

What to wear:

You are on safari and out in the bush so make sure that you are comfortably dressed with comfortable shoes. Always have a mix of clothing including: summer clothes, light raincoat, warm top and a hat.

Punctuality

Please be on time when you meet your vehicles for the game drives. If you run late you may delay the rest of the trip or miss something wonderful!

Climate

Always remember that the African Sun may look gentle but it is strong and can be harsh. Too much sun can lead to headaches, dehydration, nausea and dizziness. Rather look after yourself by using sun screen and a hat versus trying to get a nice African Tan.

Drinking Water

In built-up areas the water is safe to drink (mostly in South Africa) however, some areas it is not safe to drink the tap water at all! So we rather recommend that you drink bottled water at all times to prevent any illness. You may use the tap water to rinse your mouth when brushing your teeth! Ice is generally fine to consume, but sometimes it is better to be cautious. We advise you to rather drink bottled water at all times in Africa!

Food and drink

Africa is famous for its fruit and fresh vegetables – which can be enjoyed all around Africa. Fruit and Vegetables should be peeled before eating. Drinks (including spirits) and cigarettes can be bought in most areas but are normally quite expensive. On our Safaris we do provide most/all meals which are prepared by our guide or at a lodge.

Anti-malaria medication

A lot of areas in Africa are affected by Malaria – we strongly recommend that you take your anti-malaria medication. Take your medication exactly as its prescribed and directed, don't skip any medication! At the end of your safari, if at any time you develop influenza symptoms please consult your doctor immediately.

Power and Electricity

Most places (hotels, lodges) have electricity. But we always recommend that you should take a flash light with you on safari. Always remember if you plug something in (e.g.: One of your appliances) there may be a different voltage! The usual voltage is 220-240 AC. If your appliance does not match this voltage you need to bring a converter with as some lodges may not have a converter for you to use...

Photos

There will be many amazing photo's that you will want to capture along the way on your safari. But, you need to make sure you don't take any photos of any people without their permission. Also, never take pictures of anyone/anything in the military, police force, armed forces, government, presidents or airports.

Animals

The animals in the bush and the ones that you may see on safari are wild and should not be approached! Animals may roam freely around so be observant and cautious when walking from place to place.

Tipping

Tipping is not included in meals unless there is a service charge included in the bill – then you don't need to tip. Normal tipping is 10% of the bill for drinks and food. Tipping for guides and drivers are always appreciated and range from US\$5 and US\$10 per day...

Driver-Guide/Safari Guide

Your driver and guide is complete with experience, information and knowledge of all the areas that you will travel to. Be sure to ask them lots of questions and feel free to chat to them about anything.
